Literacy	We will be building on the children's previous learning in English. Last year they covered units of poetry, narrative and non-fiction writing.	<p>We will be using both of our topics as a stimulus for our writing.</p> <p>For our topic 'Predators', we will be writing non-chronological reports and narratives. We will also be developing our debating skills.</p> <p>For our topic 'Urban Pioneers', we will be writing biographies, poems and narratives.</p> <p>Grammar</p> <p>Our focus in grammar will be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - using more sophisticated vocabulary, using a thesaurus to up-level words. - being more precise and consistent with punctuation 	Reading/researching our topic areas will help consolidate your child's understanding in these lessons and support them with generating some great ideas.

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - developing knowledge of tenses - extending sentence structure through use of subordinate clauses and time conjunctions <p>Spellings</p> <p>Spelling is an essential part of the New National Curriculum. This term we will be looking at word families and spelling patterns containing different suffixes. We will do this through investigating and finding patterns we can use in our written work.</p> <p>Handwriting</p> <p>We will be continuing to develop a more fluid and controlled join in the children's writing.</p>	<p>It would be great if you could help us to on top of handwriting as it is a key objective of the Year 3 National Curriculum. There are some practice sheets in the Parent Resources folder on Google Classrooms, if this would be helpful.</p>
Maths	<p>We will be building on the children's previous learning in maths.</p>	<p>We start off this term with fractions. We will move on to looking at money, then properties of shapes, and finally mass, time and capacity skills.</p> <p>We will also be working on reasoning skills to ensure the children can apply all the mathematical skills they have learnt to answering multi step problems.</p> <p>Throughout each maths topic, we continue to work on ensuring the children are able to use different written and mental strategies to solve arithmetical calculations involving the 4 main operations- addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.</p>	<p>Please try to make sure your child knows their multiplication tables. This is another essential part of the New National Curriculum.</p> <p>'Hit the button' (type it directly into Google) is a great maths game for your children to play at home. It really supports with quick recall of maths facts.</p> <p>Also, please keep on using 'TTRockStars'. It is a great, quick resource to aid the children with mental maths.</p>

(Y1 - Animals, including humans) • Describe and compare the structure of a variety of common 	<p><u>Summer 1: Animals including Humans</u></p> <p>We will be looking more in depth at different animals and how they are classified e.g. carnivore, herbivore, producer, consumer, prey, predator etc. We will be considering what is essential for survival and learning about how bodies work.</p> <p><u>Summer 2: Magnets and Forces</u></p> <p>Our big question will be: What can magnets do? We will be looking at how things move on different surfaces and notice that some forces need contact between two objects, but magnetic forces can act at a distance.</p> <p>We will be observing how magnets attract or repel each other and attract some materials and not</p>	<p>Looking through books based on these topics will be of great benefit. (Y2 - Uses of everyday materials) 	<p>Others. Compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of whether they are attracted to a magnet, and identify some magnetic materials.</p>	
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R.E.	The children are introduced to Islam in Year 2 and we will be building on this learning.	<p>In the first half term we will be learning more about Islam in our RE lessons, specifically, how a Muslim might show their commitment to God; namely the five pillars of Islam.</p> <p>After half term we will be considering 'Who is Jesus?', with specific references to stories he told and things that he said about himself. We will be thinking about what these things teach us and how they are relevant to our lives.</p>	Spending time talking to your child about what we have learnt during our RE lessons will really support your child in their understanding in our topics this term.
P.E.	We have learned about gymnastics and using different techniques and equipment in the past and have created our own dances. Music		<p>This term in music, we will be investigating and performing a range of pieces of music from different times and places including pop songs.</p> <p>We will be introducing Keyboard Skills (Pupils will learn to read basic musical notation (notes within the stave in the treble clef and basic note lengths) and be able to perform from notation. French		The children will receive a specialist French lesson each week. They will be revising and adding to their vocabulary including links to the Creative Curriculum topic. Home Learning (Atom homework)

Home learning will be set via Atom homework on a Friday and will usually consist of a piece of Maths, English and Science piece. Mental Maths and Spelling activities may also be included. Atom homework is due in on a Wednesday. Please encourage your child to get into the routine of returning home learning on time as this will help encourage positive work habits and independence.

Reading

Your child will continue to benefit from daily guided reading sessions at school. Please make sure your child reads every night. Currently your child has a reading journal which should be signed each day by an adult at home. Please feel free to leave a comment if you wish.

Equipment

Thank you to all who have organised the school pencil case containing the equipment your child will need this year. Items regularly need replacing and we would be grateful if you could support us with this. The items your Year 3 child will need are: a clear pencil case, a school pencil, a rigid 30cm ruler, a sharpener, a purple pen, a glue stick, a yellow highlighter pen, a whiteboard pen and a whiteboard eraser. Your child will only need a pen once they have earned their pen license - we will let you know when to purchase a pen.

Beginning of the day and end of the day arrangements

If anyone else is collecting your child, please do either let us know in the morning or call the school office. If you have any questions at the end of the day, please could you wait until all of the children are dismissed safely to their adults so we can follow safeguarding protocol.

Uniform

Please ensure your child is wearing the correct uniform each day, including a tie. Please support us in ensuring that the school's uniform guidelines are adhered to. Can you make sure that anything your child brings into school, especially clothes and snack boxes, are clearly labelled with their name. The children find it very distressing when they can't find their things and we use a lot of valuable teaching time locating and identifying them. Thank you for your help and support with this.

Toys

Please could you make sure all toys are kept at home. Football cards and fidget toys are not allowed in school even for golden time/break time as these often cause lots of upset and arguments in the classroom especially when items are lost. Thank you for your understanding and support with this.
