The Early Years Team extends a warm welcome to you and your child as they start school! We are looking forward to working/ continuing to work in partnership with you. This letter is for your information, outlining the learning taking place in Reception this half term as well as some important information. This half term's priority is helping the children to settle into 'big school', make friends and feel safe and secure at Trent. Now that all the children are full time we will be introducing our new project. Our project this half term will be **'Who am I?'** We hope this will help us and the children get to know each other as they explore and learn. At Trent, we recognise that your child's success is often attributed to tremendous commitment from their whole family team; so thank you in advance for your support.

Other information

P.E.

We will be starting PE in Autumn 2. The children will have PE with our specialist coaches on **Wednesdays** and **Fridays** once they are fully settled into school. We aim for lessons to be outdoors as often as possible and on their PE day for children come into school dressed in their PE kit and trainers. We will let you know more about P.E. arrangements nearer the time.

Fruit/vegetables, milk and water

Reception children receive one piece of fruit or veg as part of the Government fruit scheme. You may wish to provide your child with an additional healthy snack - fruit, veg or plain crackers/breadsticks **only** for them to eat during break times. Please place their snack in a small lidded pot, clearly labelled with their name. We are a nut/ sesame free school so NO NUTS or products containing nuts are to be sent into school. Up until their 5th birthday,

children in Reception class can also have a carton of milk each day as part of the Government milk scheme. In addition, please provide your child with a filled water bottle every day, clearly marked with their name. We discourage single use plastic bottles and fruit juice/squash is not allowed.

School Lunch

All children are now entitled to a free school lunch. We encourage you to contact Julie Ring in the office: office@trent.barnetmail.net if you believe your child may qualify for Pupil Premium (previously free school meals) as the school receives extra funding. If your child has any medical conditions, allergies or food intolerances, please contact Mrs. Martha Murray (our lead first aider) via the school office so that we can cater for their needs.

R.E.

We follow the London Diocesan Board of Education R.E. syllabus and our first unit is: ***'Who cares for this special World and why?'*** As part of this learning please send in a photograph (can be a photocopy) of your child as a baby (please label with their name on the back) and an item that is 'precious' to your child. This could be a special toy (no soft toys please) book, shiny shell etc. Please send this in in named carrier bag.

Understanding the World

Geography

We will be looking at different homes around the world and would be very grateful if you could send in a photo of **one** aspect of your home e.g. front door, room or feature e.g. fireplace.

History

We will also be exploring the concept of 'memories' with the children. It would be amazing if each child could please bring in an item or photo/photocopy of an item for discussion. This could be an old family photo of grandparents, an old teddy, something your child wore/used as a baby, an old or unusual object etc.

Reading

Please continue to read with your child at home. Each week your child will choose a book from our class library to enjoy reading at home with you. This is not a 'levelled' reading book, rather a book to read together. These books are self-selected by the children and should be returned on **Fridays** (via their book bag) so that they can choose another book. You will receive more information about how we teach reading at Trent in due course.

Homework

Reception children will not have homework until they are fully settled into school. Homework will be supporting the learning that has been happening that week within the classroom. Work will be set via our homework platform **Google Classroom**. You will receive more information about user names and passwords in due course.

Birthdays

As a Barnet Gold Award healthy school we discourage sweets/chocolates for birthdays. If desired, you may wish instead to donate a book for our class library. The book will be inscribed with your child's name, read to the class and then put in our class library for the children to enjoy.

Behaviour Policy

The Positive Behaviour Policy will be clearly explained to all the children across the school. In Reception we will be encouraging and recognising positive behaviour by rewarding children who do well in a variety of ways.
